(Springfield) Competition Update



The weeks before competition were busy for everyone. All the last minute items needed to be addressed. We had one out of bag session where we were able to work on the competition robot, ensure that everything worked perfectly and have actual drive practice with it.

Imagery finished the pit book, aka Paragon's Bright Ideas, to give a pictorial and editorial reference to what the team does throughout the year to share with other teams and the judges. They also finished updating the robot cart with the

weeks of solid drive practice before our first competition.



Thursday was our first day of the competition where we unpacked and got our robot inspected. Things did not start out so great.

At first, we were told our tote grabbing mechanism was illegal because it was too dangerous. We had to completely rethink our design



and come up with something new. Where is Wendy's when you really need it? Our new design, consisting of a set of aluminum teeth was not our vision, but it still works surprisingly well. Also, at the last minute, programming had to update the software on our robot in order to finalize the code and communication between the drive station and the robot.

Second Half

On Friday, team members showed up bright and early for an exciting day of competition and cheering. (Missing school helped offset the early arrival time a little bit) Again things did not start off so well.

During our first match there





was delayed communication with the robots, resulting in very low scoring. Luckily, it was an issue with the play field computers so we got to replay that match at the end of the day. As the day progressed, we got better with each match. We were able to lift

Throughout Friday we were all over the place with rankings but ended the day at rank 13 out of 33!







students (and some mentors), and the team debuted the new mascot costume.




The team finished ups its qualification matches and thanks to the hard work of the drive team, we placed 11 out of 33. During the selection process the team

partners in the final rounds. We paired up with teams 191, The








at the quarterfinals. Even though we did not walk away with any awards we did make a good showing with the robot, were highly spirited, showed our image well

Flowers award by the team. He was surprised







The Tow Mater Spirit award went to team 166, as we could hear them yelling and screaming behind us whenever they were cheering! Finally, the Doc Hudson Gracious



robot.








Springfield was a time of trials and tribulations.
