The First Trial

Our first real test for the robot in nearing: Suffield Shakedown. Our practice bot ideas must be finalized and ready to go before this event. After which, we will have a better understanding of the impacts of our manufacturing and coding choices. Continue reading for information on what the team has done as we approach February 18th.

Build:

Despite our loss of our Thursday and Sunday build sessions due to weather, the build team is working harder than ever to prepare our final robot. Even though a few new interpretations of the bumper



rules took us by surprise, the team is always ready to problem solve new challenges. We may have to adapt the ball intake mechanism to fold inside the bumpers to pass inspection, but more careful reading of the rule book will

confirm. Our final chassis, after being assembled last week, has been taken apart and painted to fit the steampunk theme. Now that the team knows how to assemble the final chassis, everything is fitting into place faster than ever. A final gear-collector has been made out of lexand and riveted together, soon to be added to the support beams of

the final robot. The new batteries also arrived and have been taped and labeled (with quite lovely handwriting, by the way).





Imagery:

This week in imagery, it is all about dividing and conquering. Certain members are focusing on the pit book, by adding new



events we did this year and organizing pictures to include. Others are going back to edit the storybook, adding more key plot ideas to make the adventure more interesting. More pictures are also being taken to add to certain scenes of the book. The team is still coming up with robot names
